Our Facilities

Currently, we operate from two BTP Hub's around London. Our primary station is on Tangerine Street, Southwark. This is where all officers will start and end their shift. The Inner London Hub contains secured parking, office space, equipment storage and a small recreational area.

In addition to our Inner London Hub, we also operate from a smaller hub based in the Heathrow Car Park on Greenwich Parkway, Hounslow. This hub is in a prime location as this is where the start of the tube line is. This building is used for officers to complete paperwork and provide a high visibility presence in the area.

At present, we do not operate our own detention suites. As such, the Metropolitan Police have granted the BTP access to its custody facilities for the booking and housing of prisoners. BTP officers must follow the instructions of custody staff and should remain professionally courteous.
