Emergency Ambulance Crew

You are responsible for driving the ambulance and assisting the Paramedics with providing medical care.



Paramedic

You are responsible for patient care and clinical decision making. You can take additional training to join a specialist division.



Clinical Team Manager

CTM's are frontline leaders who provide clinical mentorship and duty decision making. It is the first role in the brass team.



Advanced Paramedic UC

Advanced Paramedics UC have expert clinical knowledge in urgent care settings. They can provide enhanced patient care.



Advanced Paramedic CC

Advanced Paramedics CC have expert clinical knowledge in critical care settings. They can provide 'hospital-like' treatment.



MERIT Doctor

MERIT Doctors are authorised to perform highly advanced procedures on the roadside. They primarily work with HEMS.

Training Opportunities

Here at the London Ambulance Service, we offer a wide range of professional development opportunities. All of our service brass members are clinical mentors. This means that you can expect 'on demand' clinical mentorship allowing you to gain the knowledge to progress through clinical scopes. This method is tailored to each individual, as each member has their own personal development portfolio.

The service is dedicated to improving professional standards in every setting. For this reason, CERAD course are offered to every service member. Sessions are done individually by booking times on a set date. Information regarding these sessions will be posted in the #division-announcements.

'Continuous Professional Development' sessions are also offered to crews to focus on specific clinical areas.

The service's education and training department is lead by the Clinical Education & Training Manager, a role within the Area Leadership Team.



Specialist Divisions

Hazardous Area Response Team

The Hazardous Area Response Team (HART) is a specialist team who are trained and equipped to provide urgent care whilst operating in complex or dangerous environments. The team work inside of incident 'Hot Zones' to ensure everyone is safe including crews and other emergency services.

The team primarily operates at a Paramedic clinical scope. This allows for professional development opportunities throughout the service and division.

The Hazardous Area Response Team (HART) is led by the Head of Resilience and Special Assets, a role in the Area Leadership Team.





Specialist Divisions

HEMS Advanced Trauma Team

The Critical Care Advanced Trauma Team (HEMS) is a team of paramedics and doctors specialised in Critical Care. They are teamed with an Emergency Doctor and treat the most seriously ill patients and transport by air or road. The team consist of the most skilled individuals within the London Ambulance Service.

The Critical Care Advanced Trauma Team (HEMS) is led by the Head of Resilience and Special Assets, a role in the Area Leadership Team.





Specialist Divisions

Motorcycle Response Unit

The London Ambulance Service Motorcycle Response Unit (MRU) adds additional flexibility to the delivery of care to service users, allowing single responders (Registered Paramedics) to avoid heavy traffic and often reach incidents before an emergency ambulance can.

Only registered paramedics can use this. The Head of Resilience and Special Assets oversees its operations.





Service Vehicles

A&E Ambulance (DCA)

These are the bread and butter of the London Ambulance Service. Without these ambulances, we would not be able to transport patients to hospital. There are always two practitioners on board.

Fast Response Unit (FRU)

These allow us to reach a patient quicker and provide care until an ambulance arrives. They can also be used to attend low-priority calls, keeping our main resources free for the more serious calls.
